Set against the breathtaking backdrop of Jimbour House, this three-day event promises a unique and immersive Southern Queensland experience like no other.

Prepare to be captivated by performances from internationally renowned Opera Queensland soloists Eva Kong, Teddy Tahu Rhodes, and Iain Henderson, joined by musicians from Ensemble Q, Queensland Conservatorium, Griffith University and Camerata – Queensland's Chamber Orchestra.

From Sunrise poolside sessions to a Long Lunch in The Courtyard, Hangar Concerts, evening Garden Soirees, market stalls, family activities and tours of Jimbour House, each day will be filled with not only classical music performances, but a diverse tapestry of dining and cultural experiences.

Including a special Mother's Day program on Sunday featuring a high tea for Mum, complemented by enchanting intimate orchestral performances inside Jimbour House. Following on from their sell-out success last year, four of Opera Queensland's leading artists will present recitals of much-loved opera classics in the House's intimate and beautiful drawing room.

Daryl Raven, Acting CEO of QLD Music Festival, expressed excitement about the event's return, including the open-air Amphitheatre for the first time since 2019.

"We're thrilled to welcome back Opera at Jimbour, a cherished event that has captivated thousands of locals, travellers and opera lovers alike over the event's history, for this unique cultural tourism experience.

The return of the Amphitheatre with a concert performance of Puccini's "Tosca" adds an extra layer of magic to Saturday, offering patrons the opportunity to experience world-class performances, against the picturesque backdrop of the Darling Downs, creating unforgettable memories for all."

The Hon. Michael Healy MP, Minister for Tourism, said that "This signature event set against the backdrop of this historic home on the fertile Jimbour Plains is part of the Queensland Music Trails showcasing Queensland only tourism experiences to a soundtrack of Australia's finest musical acts.

"The Miles Government is investing \$20 million in Queensland Music Trails over three years from 2023 to 2025 because we know events like this bring visitors from around the nation and from overseas, supporting good local jobs and our visitor economy.

"May sees the return of the Southern Trail which will once again feature the best of the Western Downs, following on from the 9-day Outback Trail commencing in Goondiwindi on 13 April."

Presenting Partner Opera Queensland, renowned for the exceptional talent of its artists, will bring Eva Kong (playing Tosca), Teddy Tahu Rhodes (playing Scarpia), and Iain Henderson (playing Cavaradossi) to grace the stage in the Amphitheatre at the iconic Jimbour House (recently featured in the global #1 Netflix streaming hit show Boy Swallows Universe), providing a captivating musical operatic journey throughout the weekend.

Opera Queensland CEO & Artistic Director, Patrick Nolan said that "Opera Queensland's connection with QMF and Jimbour over the years has played an important role in our mission to share the wonder and joy of opera with audiences far and wide. The majesty and beauty of Jimbour House has made the perfect backdrop to performances that welcomed audiences onto the lawns to experience artists of the highest calibre sharing fine music and song.

Trish and Paul Dean, co-Artistic Directors of Ensemble Q, have returned in 2024 to curate a beautiful program of chamber music to complement the majestic performance of Puccini's Tosca and our recital concerts. There are few other places as unique as Jimbour House where audiences have the chance to be immersed in music from sunrise to well after sunset."

Adding to the allure, Camerata – Queensland's Chamber Orchestra, will present their signature piece, 'Four Seasons Re-Imagined,' a re-composition of Vivaldi's 'The Four Seasons' by Max Richter on Saturday night, elevating the already extraordinary lineup.
